Condo town halls popular among boards and owners

Along with discussing various changes and other hot topics, the seminars also feature a Q & A session about any community association topic

and how to incorporate law changes into their communities. Part of the seminars will also be used to clear up misconceptions of how boards operate and the power they

Kaye said each year the concerns of attendees change and topics are al-

ways different.

"As it has developed, we have found that each town hall meeting tends to be unique because each new audience brings different topics and questions, which are fully covered for all in attendance," Kaye said.
